

REDUCING THE SUPPLY TO SAVE LIVES:

To reduce the amount of prescription drugs on the street, Assemblyman Ra helped create the I-STOP program to prevent "doctor shopping" by giving pharmacists access to the state's real time Prescription Drug Monitoring Program. Doctor shopping occurs when an individual visits multiple practitioners in an attempt to receive a prescription for controlled substances for either personal use or street sale.

EXPANDING CARE:

In 2011, Assemblyman Ra helped pass the Good Samaritan Act, which allows individuals to seek out medical care for someone who is experiencing a drug or alcohol overdose without fear of arrest. This legislation will help ensure that those who are abusing drugs can get the treatment they need.

A PRESCRIPTION FOR SAFETY:

Theft of prescription drugs through the mail has contributed to the influx of dangerous drugs finding their way onto our streets. That's why Assemblyman Ra passed legislation to restrict health insurers from mandating the use of mailorder pharmacies.
