From a lengthy budget process to the legislative session to many changes in our community, 2017 has been a busy year so far! I hope you enjoy reading about some of these highlights below and catching up with our office. Thank you again for your support this year and every year!

We stood with seniors in restoring \$17 million dollars to senior centers, which provide continued education, meal services, and more to so many in Queens. We also brought better compensation to those who care for New York's most vulnerable. Starting in 2018, direct care workers who care for those with developmental disabilities will be receiving a 3.25 percent raise. All New Yorkers deserve a fair, living wage and I will continue to fight for that in Albany.

Post-budget, I authored and passed two bills in both chambers and five more bills in the Assembly, addressing such issues as expanding flexible working arrangements to increase work-life balance, improving rehabilitative programs for women, banning solitary confinement for pregnant women, and combatting domestic violence.

In the district, I continued working to protect small businesses and pedestrians, touring local small businesses in Oakland Gardens with State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli. I also secured long-awaited traffic safety improvements for our community, including many changes in front of M.S. 74 Nathaniel Hawthorne in Oakland Gardens and a crosswalk on Blossom Avenue in Flushing.

This Fall, I am thrilled to announce the release of my new **Senior Resource Guide** for services in and around the community. I am also launching a new **Participatory Budgeting** effort at the state level. Please read inside for further information on the program and how to get involved.

Fighting for a Fair Chance

Increasing Tax Exemptions

Good news! Legislation I co-sponsored to raise the maximum income threshold for senior and disabled homeowners under SCHE and DHE programs has been signed into law. With the expansion of this benefit, I am confident that more seniors will be able to stay in the communities they have long called home. This bill raises the maximum annual income threshold to \$58,400, taking effect immediately. Please feel free to contact my office for application assistance.



Supporting Medical Care and Treatment

Legislation I authored this year to expand coverage for eating disorders passed! Eating disorders are real, complex, devastating conditions that affect health, productivity, and families across New York. This legislation closes a gap in coverage by requiring insurance companies to cover all aspects of eating disorders treatment, expanding coverage beyond anorexia and bulimia, and providing relief for families facing mounting medical costs.

Celebrating Our Heritage

Commemorating Israel with Ambassador Dani Dayan

It was an honor to welcome Ambassador Dani Dayan, Consul General of Israel in New York, to Albany this session (his first!) as we celebrated Israel's independence Day! To commemorate the occasion, I introduced a legislative resolution that was taken up and passed by the State Legislature.



Pushing Back Against Anti-Semitism

Over the past few months I have been actively working with local law enforcement and in the Assembly to counter the rise of hate crimes against Jewish communities across New York. Most recently, I wrote a letter to President Trump urging him to fill the current vacancy in the U.S. Department of State for a Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat anti-Semitism, a position that has been key in fighting anti-Semitism overseas. I will continue pushing for solutions that address the uptick in hate crimes, and also ask that we join together in condemning such actions that have no place in New York.

Rallying Around Education

Increasing State Education Funding

This year, we increased K-12 education aid for a total of \$25.7 billion, which is a 4.1% increase from last year, as well as a \$700 million increase for Foundation Aid, for a total of \$17.2 billion. Thanks to the teachers from District 25 & 26 (pictured below) who traveled up to Albany on United Federation of Teachers Lobby Day for their continued advocacy!



Engaging Our Youth

It is always great to stop by and visit our schools! This time I had the pleasure of spending time with the fifth graders at P.S. 46 while reading from Catherine Stier's *If I Were President*. Now more than ever it is important to teach kids at a young age about civic involvement! This Fall we also welcome students of P.S. 376 opening in Bayside!
