Dear Fellow Motorist:



Street Cleaning Rules

New York City suspends alternate side parking regulations, for both street cleaning purposes and traffic flow, on the legal and religious holidays listed above. It is illegal to park within 15 feet of either side of a fire hydrant. Double parking of passenger vehicles is illegal at all times, including street cleaning days. Be responsible and park legally.

Major Legal Holidays

On major legal holidays, stopping, standing and parking are permitted except in areas where stopping, standing and parking rules are in effect seven days a week (for example, "No Standing Anytime"). Accordingly, parking meters will not be in effect on major legal holidays.
