

Colton Fighting for the Best Education for All Our Children

As a former teacher, **Assemblyman William Colton** knows the importance of quality education. He has long fought to correct the inequitable funding which high needs schools, like NYC public schools, have been subjected to.

This year he helped pass a budget providing a **\$1.6 billion increase** in school aid over last year. He fought for **\$300 million** in state funding for NYC Universal Pre-K, in addition to the \$300 million in the year before. In addition, the state budget includes \$5 million for libraries, a full \$14.3 million restoration to teacher center funding and \$98.5 million for 4201 schools which help students with disabilities.

Since education of children in parochial schools and yeshivas is also important, he worked to make sure they also got help. While the Education Investment tax credit was not passed this year, he successfully fought to include **\$250 million** in additional funding over two years for mandated services previously not reimbursed to these non-public schools.

Colton Improving Neighborhood Quality of Life

Street and Transportation Improvements

Assemblyman Colton, working together with Councilman Mark Treyger, Councilman David Greenfield and community leaders Nancy Tong and Charles Ragusa, personally traveled our streets identifying and reporting over 200 cracks and potholes after the past winter.

Last year DOT repaved **86th Street, Bay Parkway, Avenue P, and Kings Highway**, among others. This year working with **Councilman Mark Treyger** and **Councilman David Greenfield** many more streets are scheduled for repaving including **28th Avenue** from Bath to Cropsey, **Cropsey Avenue** from Shore Parkway to Bay Parkway, **25th Avenue from Bath to Stillwell, 19th Avenue** from 86th to 65th Street and numerous side streets.

Also this year, the MTA is finally starting renovation to the N Line stations from 86 Street to Bay Parkway after many complaint letters and petitions from Assemblyman Colton.



Promoting Our Veterans

Assemblyman Colton always stresses the importance of honoring our veterans whether visiting a school or a senior center or a community gathering. He has supported state legislation to provide better benefits and protections for our veterans, as well as hosting Veteran's Day events honoring our neighborhood veterans.


