Colton Sets Up Neighborhood Watch to Protect Against City Worksite Violations in Continued Fight Against Garbage Station





PETITIONS DELIVERED TO CITY HALL

COLTON SETS UP NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH



Assemblyman Colton has set up an Anti-Waste Task Force, Co-Chaired by Charles Ragusa and Nancy Tong, to document and expose the dangerous actions by the City on the construction site. Colton recruited Neighborhood Watch volunteers to photograph the unsafe conditions at the site.

PRESENCE OF CONTAMINANTS ON SITE CONFIRMED

An EPA on-site inspection on August 21 has now confirmed much of what the neighborhood watch volunteers exposed. In addition, the City Department of Sanitation has now admitted that there are lead contaminants in a portion of the land, as well as in the water bottom, and we are continuing to demand that all work should be stopped until the community has the opportunity to be informed of what is being done to protect against these contaminants.

COMPLAINT FILED WITH U.S. EPA

Colton and 46th A.D. Assemblywoman Pamela Harris, together with Councilmembers Mark Treyger and David Greenfield, State Senator Diane Savino and Congressman Daniel Donovan, and the anti Waste Task Force Co-Chairs Charles Ragusa and Nancy Tong, directly reached out to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to investigate the dangerous conditions exposed by the photographs taken by the Neighborhood Watch volunteers. These dangerous actions include soil and debris getting into the waters because of the failure to install protective barriers around the site, dust blowing from the site, large ponds of storm waters extending onto the neighboring properties, and contaminated dredged materials being spilled into our waters.

Colton Brings Dramatic New Clean Up Services to Our Neighborhood

ADDITIONAL STREET SWEEPING BROUGHT TO NEIGHBORHOOD

For years, Assemblyman Colton has been working to resolve the serious problem of making our neighborhood cleaner. Assemblyman Colton and Council Member Mark Treyger are working together to bring the cleaning services of The DOE Fund and Wildcat Service Corporation to the neighborhood. These non-profit organizations provide workers who will manually sweep streets such as 86 Street, Avenue U, and 18 Avenue, three to four times a week.

Assemblyman Colton will continue to work for dramatic improvements in keeping our neighborhood clean.

COLTON'S SPEAK UP AND CLEAN UP CAMPAIGNS CONTINUE




Photo showing one of COLTON'S recent famous CLEAN UPS which attract hundreds of neighborhood youths to clean up our streets.


Colton Fighting For Our Schools



Assemblyman William Colton fights tirelessly every year to improve our school system so that the students get access to quality, affordable education. Over the last year, he secured a budget increase of \$1.6 billion in education. He also fought to continue the full-day Universal Pre-K program and secured a budget \$600 million over 2 years to fund it. He helped pass the Assembly's Families First agenda that provides access to quality child care while allowing parents to work. Another important piece of legislation that Assemblyman Colton fought for focuses on improvements of state education guidelines, such as teacher evaluation and teacher professional development, as well as limiting high-stakes testing and ensuring that local input from parents is heard. He also led fight to pass the Smart Schools Initiative, a \$2 billion bond to construct new pre-K classrooms. Assemblyman Colton recognizes the importance of a safe and supportive environment for college students. This year, he sponsored legislation requiring all NY colleges to implement uniform policies and procedures regarding sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, stalking, and activity that may otherwise violate codes of conduct.

COLTON CALLS ON CITY LEADERS TO SUPPORT POLICE

Colton said, "After the killing of four police officers within 11 months, city leaders must step up and work together to create stronger policies to make sure guns are taken off the streets and away from criminals. Placing unreasonable restrictions on professional police actions such as 'Stop and Frisk,' just makes the criminals more brazen while displaying their disregard for police authority."

LET'S WEAR BLUE RIBBONS TO SHOW OUR SUPPORT


