

PASSING LEGISLATION FOR PRESERVATION

My first piece of legislation to preserve the crucial resource of New York State's Bluefish has been approved by the Assembly. Co-sponsored by Assemblyman Steven Englebright, this bill extends the Department of Environmental Conservation's ("DEC") regulatory authority for an additional three years, and ensures that the DEC continues to be able to maintain compliance with the Fishery Management Plan.
