ASSEMBLYWOMAN JOYNER SUPPORTS ROBERTO CLEMENTE'S NEW REHAB PLANS



BRONX, N.Y. – Governor Cuomo previously announced the start of construction on \$35 million in projects that will help to ensure that Roberto Clemente State Park's waterfront is more storm-resilient. The projects will protect the park and surrounding neighborhood – including the residents of River Park Towers – from flooding. The additional funds will also renovate the park's upper plaza.

"Roberto Clemente State Park is an important escape for the Bronx community, its families and our children. People of the Bronx, and residents in my district, are proud to call themselves Bronxites; we are lucky to have such beautiful parks in our Borough. That is why I commend the work of Gov. Andrew Cuomo and his administration to transform Roberto Clemente State Park's waterfront and protect nearby residents from the harms of rushing flood water in the event of a storm. Superstorm Sandy may have left some bruises on Roberto Clemente State Park, but thanks to additional funding from the Governor, its future as a mainstay in the Bronx will be preserved. I also appreciate the work of my fellow Bronx elected officials, as they have helped to guarantee upgrades for the park's plazas."

ASSEMBLYWOMAN JOYNER SUPPORTS RAISING THE MINIMUM WAGE TO \$15

Joining with Bronx community leaders and advocates from throughout the state, Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner is a strong supporter of raising the minimum wage to \$15 an hour. "With the high cost of living and rising rents squeezing the budgets of families throughout our community, I have been a vocal advocate for raising the minimum wage to a level that makes sense for families throughout the Bronx," Assemblywoman Joyner said.

Voting for legislation (Assembly Bill 7257) that would phase in the higher minimum wage Assemblywoman Joyner noted that it would ensure that a full-time employee working 40 hours a week would make \$31,200. "Paying workers a livable wage is not too much to ask in the modern economy," Assemblywoman Joyner said.

ASSEMBLYWOMAN JOYNER GAINS INCREASE FOR FOSTER CARE FAMILIES

The current foster care system needs additional remediation after years of neglect. That is why **Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner** has been determined to offer help to those families and children that require assistance. Leading this fight, Assemblywoman Joyner introduced **Assembly Bill A. 8007** to provide foster care families with a three percent increase in support.

After she introduced the legislation, the **New York State Office of Children and Family Services** and the **Division of the Budget** gave a two percent increase to foster care families. Also, changes have been approved for the administrative rate methodology that will benefit foster care providers. While this is not a permanent fix, this is a step in the right direction.

Following multiple years of flat foster care rates, those that provide the necessary help to our children and families will now gain some additional assistance in the form of additional funding for their hard, tireless work.

"Our foster care system is an investment in the future of our community and it has served more than 11,000 children this year alone," Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner said. "For seven years the families that provide this essential service went without an increase – and I am glad to see that we were able to make an increase possible."
