Assemblywoman Joyner Hosts Safety Presentations for NYCHA Families





Assemblywoman Joyner Fights for All Bronx Families in 2016

In her second year as your state legislator, Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner has continued to represent our interests and concerns in Albany and throughout the 77th Assembly District.

These issues ranged from preserving affordable housing, investing in the Bronx's public schools, supporting cultural institutions and museums, requiring prison officials to be responsive to inmate families in their time of mourning, ensuring that families remained in their homes with key tenant support and legal assistance and making sure your voice is heard – whether you are a tenant who is worried about the Department of City Planning's Jerome Avenue Study or a possible rent increase from the NYC Rent Guidelines Board.

Assemblywoman Joyner publicly supported a rent rollback for the more than 33,000 apartments under rent regulation in our district and helped to protect tenants from landlords seeking to jack up rents. Also during a public scoping meeting for the Jerome Avenue Neighborhood Study, she reiterated to NYC Department of City Planning officials that the concerns of those individuals who were born and raised in the Bronx and have remained here should be a top priority. This includes residents, the local businesses, restaurants, and auto workers located in our community.

Albany Victories:

In Albany, Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner helped to enact a \$15 minimum wage, instituted paid family leave, invested in public and higher education and protected public health – all measures that have helped to lift families down on their luck and offer future opportunities.

Key legislative victories included the signing into law of Assembly Bill A.7500, a bill which requires the New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS) to be responsive to the next of kin when a loved one or family member passes away behind bars.

Fighting for Families:

Making sure all children are safe, Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner's Assembly Bill A.7451, which offers greater protections for families seeking safe quality childcare, passed both the Assembly and the Senate in 2016. It will provide greater protection for families by mandating the New York State Office of Children and Family Services to investigate and audit current child care operations advertising their services in New York State on the Internet.

Public Health:

Bronx County is notoriously ranked last when it comes to the overall health of our residents. As a result, Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner passed two resolutions in the Assembly to

encourage additional awareness of asthma and maternal depression.

Due to the exceptionally high incidence of asthma in the Bronx, and recent cases involving mothers inflicted with maternal depression, Assemblywoman Joyner sought to raise public interest of these important health topics that affect large portions Bronx families.



Students in Temporary Housing:

Since her election to the New York State Assembly, Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner has been a relentless advocate for additional state funding to expand opportunities and improve results for children living in homeless shelters. Because of her unwavering support, Mayor Bill de Blasio's administration promised a \$10.3 million bellwether investment to improve results for children who are doubled-up or living in homeless shelters and temporary housing. Eighteen percent of the all students in Bronx School District 9 were in temporary housing during the 2013-14 school year, according to the

Department of Education. This critical initiative has already seen results in expanding educational support for youth in shelters including investments in onsite literacy programs, attendance assistants to reduce chronic absenteeism, and social workers to provide emotional support for families.

District 9 Schools:

In supporting District 9 schools, Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner has also allocated funding for renovations and upgrades to the school auditoriums of P.S. 199 The Shakespeare School and P.S. 109 The Sedgwick School. She was instrumental in asking New York City to fix a crumbled sidewalk which lines a vacant lot on Popham and Montgomery Avenues near P.S. 109, which has been a hazard for the Sedgwick School community and families for nearly three decades.

Museums & Community Institutions:

For our cultural and religious institutions, Assemblywoman Latoya Joyner secured funding to push forward major architectural enhancements and upgrades to the Bronx Museum of the Arts and fund programming for the Bronx Children's Museum. The Assemblywoman's legislation, Assembly Bill A.8120-A, also was officially signed into law and ensures Mill Pond Park will remain as the permanent home of the Bronx Children's Museum.

Assemblywoman Joyner secured \$500,000 in funding for the renovation of the the Latino Pastoral Action Center including replacement of boilers and the HVAC system. Under the direction of Rev. Dr. Ray Rivera, LPAC focuses on schools, family, community-based organizations and the church. Also she secured \$700,000 in funding that will help renovate and upgrade BronxWorks' athletic facilities, pool, locker rooms and front steps, an essential organization and community hub that helps individuals and families improve their economic and social well-being.

Representatives will be available in the Assemblywoman's Community Office every 2nd Thursday of the month from 10 am-12 pm, starting January 12 at 910 Grand Concourse, Suite 1JK (between E. 162nd and E. 163rd Streets), Bronx, N.Y. 10451.

IDNYC is a government-issued photo identification card that offers everyone access to City services and free access to renowned cultural institutions. The ID is even available to those that may have difficulty obtaining other government-issued IDs regardless of immigration status, including most vulnerable communities, which encompass the homeless, youth, the elderly, undocumented immigrants and the formerly incarcerated.
