#### **Legislative Update:**

County Corners Legislation

Thank you to my colleagues in the NYS Assembly for overwhelmingly supporting my bill for passage that would require minimal training for County Corners and their deputies. This is NOT an unfunded mandate on county government but in fact is a requirement for the Coroner to seek on his or her own time.

Deaths are difficult enough. Their cause and discovery need to be handled properly and state designated training is the right way to go.

New York Buy American Act

On Wednesday the NYS Assembly announced the passage of the New York Buy American Act to strengthen both the New York and national iron and steel manufacturing industries (A.8427-A). The measure builds upon current law to ensure American-made steel and iron are utilized in state road and bridge projects to help ensure taxpayer money is being used to boost the economy and create good jobs.

Manufacturing has long been emblematic of what we do best – create and innovate. Times change, but we will always need to build and repair roads and bridges. So when it comes to the

companies we do business with, it's only right that we partner with the American manufacturers of iron and steel that will invest in jobs and help grow our economy.
