Yes, Assemblyman, I believe that public assistance recipients should be living in our community for a year before receiving assistance. END WELFARE TOURISM.

- Establish a one-year residency requirement for those seeking Medicaid assistance. This prevents “Welfare Tourism,” where people move to New York solely for the generous welfare benefits. (Assembly Bill 5901)

GETTING CLEAN & SOBER.

- Establish drug screenings as a pre-qualification for public assistance. This makes sure that the applicant is living a clean life and is employable after receiving assistance. Government assistance is a stepping stone, not a way of life. (Assembly Bill 6146)

VICE? NO DICE!

- Establish the “Public Assistance Integrity Act,” which would ensure that these funds go toward feeding hungry children and not to unnecessary vices like alcohol, cigarettes, and gambling. (Assembly Bill 2386)
