**Co-sponsoring New Legislation:** This past fall, I co-sponsored several new pieces of legislation for our state, including the Veterans and Hope Act on October 7<sup>th</sup>.

On November 4<sup>th</sup>, I co-sponsored A.5082, which will reduce plastic bottle waste in hotels; A.8054, which will reduce discrimination against visually and hearing-impaired individuals; and A.10801, which will incentivize and promote tourism in certain districts of Long Island.

## I have also proposed legislation A.8498, which would designate a portion of interstate 87 as the "Colin Powell Thruway."
