A Message from Keith:



Summer is one of the most anticipated times of the year—especially here on Long Island, where our beautiful coastline offers countless opportunities to enjoy the season. As the proud representative of District 12 in the New York State Assembly, I remain committed to making meaningful changes that improve our community and enhance the lives of everyone who calls this area home.

As we head into these hazy, fun-filled days, I want to take a moment to reflect on the progress we've made over the past few months.

With the 2025–26 Legislative Session coming to a close, I'm proud to continue fighting for policies that make New York safer, smarter, and cleaner. One of the legislative accomplishments I'm especially proud of is the passage of a tax exemption for widowed homeowners of police officers killed in the line of duty (A.3729). Inspired by the tragic loss of NYPD Highway Patrolman Anastasio Tsakos, this bipartisan bill will provide crucial financial relief to families enduring profound grief.

In addition, I was proud to help advance legislation to honor American hero General Colin Powell (A.1575) by renaming a portion of the I-95 corridor in the Bronx—his childhood home—in his memory. As the first African American Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and Secretary of State, General Powell's legacy deserves this lasting tribute.

Locally, I've been working closely with the Halesite Harbor Walk team and am excited to share that we're making significant progress. We've finalized a logo design and developed a strong plan to reimagine Huntington's waterfront—a project I believe will benefit our community for generations to come.

In June, I had the honor of participating in the 4th Annual Co-Occurring Disorder Conference. Our goal: to build a comprehensive system of care for those struggling with both mental health issues and substance use disorders across Long Island. This is an area I'm deeply passionate about, and I remain committed to supporting individuals and families navigating these challenges.

Protecting our children remains a top priority. I've

been actively working to combat the spread of vape shops and recreational marijuana dispensaries near schools, parks, and other vulnerable areas. Recently, I submitted a formal statement to the Islip Town Board opposing the proliferation of dispensaries, and I've worked with the Town of Huntington to revise the Town Code, now restricting vape stores from operating within 1,500 feet of places where children gather. The evidence is clear: legal dispensaries increase underage use, and we must remain vigilant to protect our youth.

And while I'm not rushing summer away, I'm excited to announce a School Supply Drive I'm co-hosting with Huntington Town Councilman Dr. Dave Bernardo, running July 1–30. Donations can be dropped off at my Assembly District Office, Huntington Town Hall, or the Flanagan Senior Center.

It's an honor to serve you in the Assembly and to work together toward a stronger, safer, and more vibrant community. Thank you for your continued support—and I hope you and your family enjoy everything this beautiful season has to offer.

CDPAP Press Conference in Albany

This is crazy!

This week, I joined several colleagues in Albany to call for a delay in the transition of the Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program (CDPAP)'s fiscal intermediary services to Public Partnerships LLC (PPL). Lawmakers and advocacy groups are urging Gov. Hochul to extend the transition deadline from April 1 to July 1, 2025, ensuring the 280,000 elderly and disabled New Yorkers who rely on CDPAP continue receiving essential home care services without disruption.

Tens of thousands of patients remain unregistered with PPL, raising serious concerns about service interruptions for some of New York's most vulnerable residents. The transition also affects over 400,000 home care aides, many of whom are facing confusion and uncertainty regarding their pay and employment status under the new system. (April 8)
