Dear Neighbor,

As we approach the beginning of the new legislative session, I want to take the opportunity to bring you up to date on how my office has been helping the community.

We are living in the most challenging times in recent memory. Democracy itself is under attack, both at home and abroad. Here, January 6th insurrectionists are finally beginning to pay the price for their actions. In Israel, Hamas terrorists committed a war crime on October 7 when they launched an unprovoked attack, murdering civilians and taking hundreds of hostages – including Americans. I was honored so many of my colleagues on both sides of the political aisle came together and signed my letter condemning this diabolical act of hate and expressing support for the State of Israel as it fights for its very existence.

Equally disturbing is the outburst of antisemitism on our own soil. While in the past it seemed more random in nature, now it's a regular occurrence, taking place not only on social media but out in the open in protests in the streets and on our college campuses. We must not give in to the forces of hate and instead stand together, united in support of freedom and democracy.

The best way to fight hate is through educating our youth about history and about engaging in dialogues that help us understand and accept our differences and commonalities. That is why I continue to both legislate and secure state grants to school districts so that they are equipped to implement thoughtful curriculum and make necessary capital improvements to their facilities. Most recently, I was pleased to see my bill A.05010 banning corporal punishment in all schools signed into law by Governor Hochul. This legislation will help our children learn in a safe school environment.

I am committed to helping improve the quality of life for residents of the 13th Assembly District. I helped modify and improve the LIRR schedule for many riders of the Oyster Bay line. I will continue to work closely with officials from the MTA to seek other ways to make the commute a little less burdensome for North Shore residents.

I am proud to represent the diverse people of this district. I am also honored to serve as Chairman of the Judiciary Committee and as President of the New York Chapter of the National Association of Jewish Legislators. 




