2022 LEGISLATIVE AND COMMUNITY UPDATES

Investing in Education

Schools are not just places to learn, they are communities that help our children grow, develop new skills and find interests and passions that will stick with them for the rest of their lives. From Pre-K to graduation day, and onto college or trade school, education is a critical step to building a bright and successful future. Through the NYS budget my office has voted to secure:

- \$31.5 billion in total School Aid for School Year 2023, the highest level of State aid ever; and
- \$34 million in capital funding for libraries; and
- Passing A10018, known as Alyssa's Law, which requires schools to consider silent panic alarm systems as part of their school safety plans; and
- \$58 million for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) ٠ programs in private and non-public schools, a record level of funding; and
- \$150 million to expand TAP to those studying part time to cover students enrolled in six or more credits (expected to help at least 75,000 students); and
- \$53 million each for SUNY and CUNY for additional full-time faculty

Protecting Our Environment

Preserving the environment for future generations is one of the most critical issues of our time, and we have continued to take action to preserve and protect our environment throughout the last year. Through the budget and in legislation, we secured more funding for the Environmental Protection Fund (EPF), set new standards for the environment and secured record funding for environmental infrastructure. Some of that information includes:

- \$4.2 billion for the Clean Water, Clean Air, and Green Jobs Environmental Bond Act*; and
- \$400 million for the EPF; and
- Passing legislation like A5390 to create new conservation standards and A2412 which plans for the purchase or lease of zero emission vehicles for state-owned vehicle fleets; and
- \$500 million investment to develop the State's offshore wind supply chains and port infrastructure, (estimated to create 2,000 new jobs)
- The \$4.2 billion Environmental Bond Act is set to be on the ballot for a vote this November in order to help reduce flood risks, protect shorelines and improve water quality

Honoring Veterans and Protecting First Responders

Our country is eternally grateful for the brave men and women who choose to protect and defend our city, our nation, and the freedoms we enjoy. The budget and legislation passed helps ensure that Veterans and our first responders get the essential support they need.

This included:

- Formalizing the Division of Veterans' Services elevation to the Department of Veterans' Services to be completed in 2023, allowing for more funding and resources; and
- Extending the Hire-a-Vet tax credit and increasing the credit from 10% to 15% of wages paid to non-disabled Veterans (20% for disabled Veterans); and
- Allowing volunteer fire departments to bill insurance companies to recover costs of providing ambulance services, allowing volunteer fire departments to recover \$100 million statewide for providing these services; and
- Providing \$1 million to study incidences of leukemia in many 9/11 first responders at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine; and
- Passing A1310 establishing the Korean War Commemorative Medal, A357 creating the Vietnam War Commemorative Medal and A6551 which requires specific reserved bed days at New York State Veterans' Homes for Veterans and their immediate families

Strengthening Transportation and Infrastructure

This year the legislature invested billions of dollars in strengthening and repairing crumbling public transportation in our state including:

- \$1 billion for the revolutionary 'Operation Pave Our Potholes' Program; and
- An increase of \$757 million to the MTA; and
- Suspension of the State sales tax imposed on fuel from June-December 2022

Supporting Our Businesses

Small businesses and the people they employ have been particularly impacted by the events of the past few years. Through the budget we were able to put these hardworking entrepreneurs at the forefront! The legislature has worked to help small businesses grow by including measures like:

- \$1 billion investment in the state's small businesses:
 - Including \$250 million in tax-credits for businesses to offset their expenses incurred from complying with COVID-19 safety protocols; and
 - \$100 million in tax relief for small businesses to help them keep their doors open (expected to help over 195,000 small businesses)
- New property-tax credit for 2.5 million eligible residents earning less than \$250,000

Defending Affordable Healthcare, Public Health Programs, and Mental Health Resources

Healthcare has never been more important, and people need and deserve the ability to see a doctor and be cared for. That's why ensuring access to quality healthcare, public health programs, and mental health resources has become even more crucial. This year the state legislature passed bills and funded programs that would:

- Increase home care worker wages by \$3 per hour which will ensure the growth of the workforce by 20 percent over the next five years; and
- Allot \$2.4 billion to be directed to improving healthcare infrastructure and \$3.9 billion in funding to provide aid to hospitals struggling financially from the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- Expand postpartum coverage for all individuals eligible for Medicaid while pregnant from 60 days to one year after they give birth

Appointed to New Commission on the Future of LIPA and PSEG

Assemblywoman Pheffer Amato was appointed to the new legislative Commission to analyze and decide the future of the Long Island Power Authority (LIPA), which encompasses PSEG, the known provider of electrical power to the Rockaway Peninsula. The Commission will be able to investigate and craft potential reforms that LIPA, and it's subsidies like PSEG, would respond to in the areas of transparency, overall operations, electrical rates, storm response and many other areas in an effort to create needed change.
