After another productive legislative session, I'm proud to report back on all that was accomplished.

This session, I focused on addressing many issues important to our district, including by passing bills related to community safety, support for our neighbors, health care, transportation, and more. These achievements are an important step forward for Queens – we have secured key resources that will make our community safer, healthier, and stronger in the upcoming years.

Since the start of the year, we officially closed over 130 cases, with a 93.5% success rate. In continuing to prioritize direct access to constituent services – our team has been working tirelessly to connect our community with resources to help improve everyone's quality of life from housing to health care. I also hosted over a dozen community events and have lots more in the works!

Keeping Kids Safe

After a twoyear pandemic hiatus, I hosted my annual bike helmet giveaway with NYC DOT. I was thrilled to see many neighbors as we distributed 855 free bike helmets to families across Eastern Queens.



Investing in Our Hospitals

In this year's state budget, I helped secure \$1 million for NYC Health + Hospital/Queens for its new HUGS infant protection system to prevent infant abduction and mother/infant mismatches. This new technology marks the biggest state investment in hospital-wide protection for infants and pediatric patients in Queens. By upgrading the HUGS system, we will now be in a better position of protecting our most vulnerable patients and their families.



Celebrating Civics in Schools

I joined P.S. 173Q and J.H.S. 216 George J. Ryan for their Civics Week celebrations. Civics Week is an NYC DOE initiative that helps students learn about civic engagement. To mark the occasion, I met with student leaders and spoke at school assemblies about the importance of civic participation and engagement.



Celebrating AAPI Heritage Month

In May, I celebrated AAPI Heritage Month by joining hundreds of families at this year's AAPI Tennis Festival co-hosted by the United States Tennis Association and Cunningham Tennis!

I am particularly proud of the bill we passed this year that makes Lunar New Year a statewide holiday in New York, bringing recognition to the most widely celebrated day in Asian culture. This year's budget also included \$30 million for Asian American serving nonprofits throughout New York.



Supporting Homeowners and Renters

Earlier this year, I partnered with the NYC Department of Finance and Commonpoint Queens for my annual housing assistance event where we helped troubleshoot issues related to complicated property tax abatement and assessment programs. As always, if you are having issues with your applications, feel free to reach out to my office.

Building a Resilient Community

In anticipation of a rainy season, I hosted a flood kit giveaway in Fresh Meadows to help protect local residents from stormwater flooding. While we keep pushing the City and State to address structural causes of flooding, these barriers provided by DEP serve as a good stopgap measure for many homeowners.

To encourage recycling, my office hosted multiple events to provide free shredding and electronic waste collection. Together with the LES Ecology Center and AAFE, over two truckloads of e-waste materials and paper were disposed of by more than 210 households, diverting them from landfills.

Expanding Schools

For as long as I am in office, I will never stop supporting our public schools. Earlier this year, I announced \$250,000 to P.S. 154 in Flushing for the purchasing of new computers and technology. P.S. 24 in Fresh Meadows is currently finalizing plans for \$250,000 worth of upgrades and renovations to their auditorium, and M.S. 74 in Oakland Gardens will have a new scoreboard and padding in the gym at the start



of the new school year. Upgrading and purchasing state-of-the-art equipment for our students is imperative to their educational success and I take great pride in facilitating these grants for our institutions. Keep an eye out for more educational funding announcements!

Fighting for a Fair Credit System

The credit score system has a long way to go before it works for consumers. Since being named Chair of the Committee on Consumer Protection, I have been working on a legislative package to ensure New Yorkers are equipped with necessary protections. In New York, we know that poor credit indicates a broken financial system, not a judgment on the consumer and it's high time our laws are adjusted to reflect that.



Cracking Down on SNAP Skimmers

After hearing from constituents, community based organizations like SelfHelp, AAFE and the Minkwon Center, and local police precincts, about rampant SNAP EBT card skimming, Senator John Liu and I introduced and passed legislation that would require local businesses to post consumer warnings of potential skimming of EBT card numbers and PINs (A4023/S6088).

The Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance reports that over 4,000 New Yorkers, often seniors and low income New Yorkers, have had their benefits stolen from EBT card skimming. The bill now awaits Governor Kathy Hochul's approval.

With this new legislation, I hope that everyone will feel safer shopping and using their SNAP EBT card. If you or anyone you know has been a victim of this skimming scheme, please reach out to my office immediately.



Safeguarding Health Care Decisions

Like millions of Americans, I've used apps to help manage my reproductive health care. This year's state budget included my legislation to protect health care access and safeguard health data privacy. Everyone should have the ability to access the care they need and make personal decisions without additional fear or concern about their personal health data being sold to the highest bidder. The stakes are too high for anything less than that.



Creating an Inclusive School System

Government should be representative for all—that includes the Jewish community too. Earlier this year, the Department of Education released a school calendar for the upcoming academic year that conflicted with Jewish religious observance. In response to a letter I led calling for a new calendar, the DOE did the right thing and remedied the school calendar by removing conflicts with religious observances.

Making Diwali a School Holiday

I was proud to sign on to the legislation that officially adds Diwali as a holiday for New York City schools! I know the impact increased cultural representation can have, whether it's in government or an educational setting. It is high time that the thousands of New Yorkers who celebrate Diwali are recognized and included.

Reckless Driving Legislation

I also introduced legislation this year to crack down on reckless driving in parking lots, allowing local law enforcement to step in as necessary to enforce violations. I drafted this legislation in response to an increase in extreme and reckless driving in area parking lots across the district. This bill will go a long way to making our communities safer and quieter and I'm committed to getting it passed!



Protecting Ratepayers

I sponsored several pieces of legislation this session to bring transparency to the utility industry and protect New Yorkers. One bill, which passed both the Senate and Assembly, would offer utility, telecom, cable, and internet customers the option of having notices sent to a trusted third party.

There are many reasons that people have difficulty keeping up with bills including older age, illness, or other difficult circumstances. This legislation would help people get the assistance they need from a trusted third party and ensure that their bills are kept up-to-date, enhancing their independence and making it easier for everyone.

Good News: this piece of legislation is ready to be called up to the Governor's desk and signed into law!
