**Indoor Dining to Resume Beginning September 30** 

Amid Coronavirus Pandemic

NYC Mayor Announces School Bus Service for First Day of School; President Trump Admits to Playing Down Coronavirus Earlier This Year; Complete the Census; and More!

 Governor Cuomo announced that indoor dining in New York City will be allowed to resume <u>beginning **September 30th**</u> with a **25%** occupancy limit.

- All restaurants that choose to reopen will be subject to strict safety protocols, including temperature checks.
- Bar service will not be permitted, and restaurants will close at midnight.
- Guidelines will be reassessed based on the data by November 1.
- NYC will provide a team of 400 enforcement personnel to work with the State Police Task Force to ensure compliance.
- The governor announced the **New York State Department of Financial Services** has taken action to "extend emergency regulations requiring" New York health insurers to waive cost-sharing associated with:
  - emergency room visits;
  - in-network telehealth visits;
  - in-network outpatient provider office visits;
  - in-network urgent care center visits;
  - in-network laboratory tests when the purpose of the visit or test is to diagnose COVID-19; and
  - in-network telehealth services for any healthcare service covered under a policy, including mental health and substance use disorder treatment until **November 9, 2020.**
- The governor announced that **\$50** fines will be handed out to subway and bus riders who do not wear a mask. Read more here.
- On Tuesday, Governor Cuomo announced that taxes on the rich might be an option if the federal government fails to come through. The state is considering a combination of budget cuts, borrowing and revenue raisers. Read more here.



- Mayor de Blasio announced school bus service will be provided for **100,000** students on the first day of school. The service will include:
  - **5,962** special education routes;
  - 2,470 general education routes; and
  - **60** bus company contracts with new safety measures.
- The mayor announced a "hyperlocal effort" by the city's **Test and Trace Corps** in the Soundview section of the Bronx. The effort included:
  - 9,700 door knocks;

- 49,000 calls to residents; and
- 1,600 COVID tests.
- Free rapid-point-of-care testing will be available through **September 15th** at Clason's Point Library at 1215 Morrison Ave.
- There are **20** days left to complete the 2020 census.
  - The mayor announced that the current NYC self response rate is 58.9% and the national self response rate is 65.5%.
- The mayor announced the required safety measures that will take place once NYC resumes indoor dining. The measures include:
  - bar tops closed for seating;
  - tables at least 6 feet apart;
  - · temperature checks at every front door;
  - test and trace data collected from at least one customer at each table; and
  - PPE for employees.
  - Once the COVID-19 positivity rate reaches **2%** or higher NYC will reassess indoor dining plans.
- The mayor provided guidance for individuals wearing face coverings.
  - Surgical masks can be work **5** days unless dirty or wet. Then should be discarded.
  - Reusable cloth face coverings should be washed in hot water and detergent or soaked in bleach solution after each full day or **8** hours of use.




