The Clean Slate Act will help our communities thrive

The plan will automatically seal certain criminal records to give more New Yorkers a second chance, reducing recidivism and helping people contribute to their communities.

How Clean Slate works:

Seals a person's record 3 years after they're released from custody for a misdemeanor (8 years for a felony) – **provided they have stayed out of legal trouble** and are not on probation or parole.

Records are not erased, only sealed. They can still be viewed under certain circumstances.

- **Safeguards are in place** to ensure records can be viewed by law enforcement, during fingerprint background checks, and for people working with children, the elderly, or other vulnerable populations.
- Clean Slate will <u>never</u> seal the records of individuals who were convicted of murder, are required to register as a sex offender or for anyone who has been convicted of a crime where a life sentence may be imposed.

How Clean Slate helps New York:

- Access to safe housing, education, and stable employment helps people rebuild their lives, reducing the cycles of poverty and crime.
- Expanding our workforce will help grow our economy that's why so many business groups support it.
