

The Young Voter Act

My bill to lower the voting age to 17 for State and Municipal elections (A.6839/A.6840) picked up steam this week when I hosted a press conference on Monday draw attention to the characteristically abysmal voter turnout in New York State.



I was joined by over 30 civically minded and engaged 16 and 17 year olds from 7 different high schools around New York City. New York State has some of the worst voting laws in the nation and we are consistently between 41st and 49th in the country in voter turnout. The election on Tuesday brought out only 24% of eligible voters in New York City. As a state, we must do more to make it easier to vote. If someone does not become an active voter by the time they are 25 then they're likely to never become an active voter. Lowering the voting age to 17 will encourage young people to get into the habit of voting while still living at home in a familiar environment, before they go off to College or elsewhere. The Young Voter Act, which I introduced in the Assembly last March also includes a requirement that New York high school students receive at least eight hours of civics instruction, and that on or before their 17th birthday, students be handed a voter registration form. My bill will streamline the registration process and along with the intensive civics education component, hopefully get young people into the habit of voting at 17.

I want to thank all of the terrific young activists who came out to join Assemblymember Simon and I at the press conference. They came from a wide variety of communities, and spoke with great poise and conviction, making a clear case as to why they should also have a voice in our democracy. I especially want to recognize Ilana Cohen, a 17 year old constituent and Senior at Beacon High School.



Ilana reminded us at the press conference that the Young Voter Act is not simply about allowing 17


