As part of the recently passed State Budget, changes were made to New York's bail laws to provide judges more clarification on setting bail for certain defendants.¹ This is a crucial step to making our city safe again but more action is needed.

ALEC'S PUBLIC SAFETY PLAN:

- Allow judges to consider a defendant's "dangerousness" when determining pre-trial release (A.3183)
- Combat serial shoplifting at our businesses by strengthening petty larceny charges (A.5029)
- Stronger police presence on our subways and transit systems
- Continue our multi-million-dollar investment in mental health and homeless services (A.3003-D)
