COLTON HONORING CHINESE AMERICAN RAILROAD WORKERS

A resolution introduced in the New York State Assembly by Assemblyman William Colton has made history as the first legislative recognition by a state of the important legacy of the Chinese American railroad workers who helped build the Transcontinental Railroad in the mid-19th century.

Assemblyman Colton wants to make sure that the workers, who faced difficult and sometimes deadly conditions as they strove to link the east and west coasts of the continent are always remembered for their contribution to American greatness. On May 14, Assemblyman Colton welcomed a group of the workers' descendants, many of whom still live in Brooklyn, to the Capitol, where the achievements of their forebears were celebrated on Chinese American Railroad Workers Day.
