

Dear Neighbors:

The 55th Assembly District has been buzzing with activity. I have brought resources to the district to address pressing needs. The legislative session enshrined into law progressive policies that help all New Yorkers.

I invited New York State Department of Health Commissioner Dr. Howard Zucker to Brownsville to hear dozens of community stakeholders express how they want \$700 million spent to improve health care services in the district.

As Chair of the Renewable Energy Committee, I am committed to increasing energy capacity and reducing demand in the 55th AD. I hosted the launch of Solarize Brownsville, a program that will install solar panels on private homes and reduce their energy bills by 25%.

Phase I of Prospect Plaza is complete, with 150 new families moving in this summer. Phase II is near completion and Phase III has begun. The redevelopment of Prospect Plaza has created construction jobs for former residents and the developers hired a local security company to provide services.

Funding was awarded for the construction of Atlantic East Apartments, a development that will build 51 affordable and 10 veterans units of new housing.

I funded the SUNY ATTAIN Lab @ St. Johns which will provide high tech computer training and employment readiness services to individuals in the district.

We now have 842 new rain gardens in Ocean Hill-Brownsville that will collect and absorb hundreds of gallons of rain water, preventing sewer overflows and flooding of local streets.

Earlier this year, I announced an on-time state budget that included paid family leave, a historic increase in the minimum wage, a tuition freeze for SUNY and CUNY, substantial funding for community schools, significant capital funding for housing, and a middle class tax cut.

The end of the legislative session was productive. The Assembly passed my signature legislation that would preserve Pre-Clearance whenever there are changes that affect certain voting districts (A.10712) to ensure that such changes do not have a discriminatory effect based on race or ethnicity. Now we must push to get it passed in the Senate and signed into law. In addition, the Assembly passed bills that would allow voting by mail, early voting, and online voter registration.

The Assembly also passed legislation to combat the heroin epidemic, establish lead testing in school drinking water, prevent deceptive telemarketing calls, protect victims of wage theft, encourage early detection of breast cancer, protect residents from excessive utility rate increases, ensure that college-bound students with immigrant parents have access to state tuition assistance, seal records for marijuana misdemeanor convictions, ban solitary confinement for pregnant women, mandate adequate nurse staffing in hospitals and acute care facilities, and protect and strengthen women's reproductive rights.

The Legislature passed a resolution that would pave the way for revoking public pensions from officials convicted of a felony. However, we need real ethics reform that would close the LLC loophole to prevent unlimited, anonymous campaign contributions
