LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Over the past year, from passing groundbreaking legislation, to making critical resources available to families and small businesses, the Assembly Majority and I have remained committed to ensuring the health, safety and well being of the residents of each District during this time as we reopen our city and recover from the effects of COVID-19.

Thus, the Assembly Majority has fought tirelessly throughout the 2021 State Legislative session to enact critical legislation and invest in resources that would directly help our communities, families and small businesses recover and rebuild from the devastating economic effects of the pandemic.

In addition to providing essential relief, the Assembly also passed a record-breaking 2021-2022 State Budget that invests in our children's future, from pre-K through Graduation Days. The Assembly Majority also ensured restorative funding for child care, family, children's programs and youth programs.

This year, I have had a host of my own legislation passed surrounding Environmental Protections, Key money savings for college students on public transportation, Property Tax Law, Homeowner Protections and General Safety.

Additionally, Governor Hochul announced the beginning of Construction on a Flood Protection Project in our neighborhood of Canarsie. The State will begin construction on flood protection in one of our most vulnerable areas of Fresh Creek's shoreline, which was affected by Superstorm Sandy 9 years ago. This will help the area recover more quickly from natural disasters. It is crucial that we take our emergency preparedness seriously in the 59th Assembly District as climate change continues to increase. Our District is particularly vulnerable to storms given our location and proximity to the water, this project will allow us to be more resilient in the event of a storm or any natural disaster.



Governor Hochul signed into law a bill that has been very personal to me in my advocacy for our community. Introduced by my colleague Senator Andrew Gounardes, The Stop Loud & Excessive Exhaust Pollution Act, will decrease the amount of noisy, illegal mufflers and exhaust systems to protect public health, safety and the quality of life of New Yorkers. This act will deter drivers from installing noisy equipment to their vehicles that will emit pollutants harmful to our communities.

Governor Hochul also signed a bill into law expanding the discrimination protections of the Human Rights Law to include for-profit colleges, universities, career schools, and English as a second language schools. By declaring that the provisions of the Human Rights Law apply to these institutions, New York State will ensure that all students are afforded legal protection against discrimination. Enacting this pivotal piece of legislation will ensure that New Yorkers are able to attend any school with protections against inequity or harassment which have no place in the education system.

As we turn the corner of this year, we realize it was the compassion, resilience and strength of New Yorkers that helped us get to this point and showed all that we can accomplish if we work together. My commitment is to keep fighting and advocating for New Yorkers while putting families first, ensuring the safety and well being of all of our community.

Park Clean-Up and Restoration

Blue Fish Festival

Big News

KingsboroughOver the last several months

I have spearheaded the push for Kingsborough Community College to become a certified offshore wind basic safety training facility. Through the advocacy of my colleagues in the State we were able to secure \$3 million for Kingsborough Community College with matching funds of \$1.5 million for the wind industry safety training which will go hand in hand with the new Wind Turbines to be installed off the coast of Long Island. These programs will train students to be a part of the new Wind Power industry here in our great city and will also enhance the existing maritime technology program at Kingsborough. Not only will this stimulate the economy but it will provide education and jobs for those in our community who are interested in wind power. Once installed these wind turbines will innovate our great city in increasing our clean energy usage and reduce our city's emissions. I am so excited to see this program get its start and to see the positive effect on our environment wind power will create for our great City.

Anti-Gun Violence Initiative

This year, the first-in-the-nation Anti-Gun Violence Initiative began in New York State. This initiative created the Office of Gun Violence Prevention which will work with the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services to compile data and pinpoint gun violence hotspots to provide resources to areas that need it most. Through the State budget and the help of the Governor and my colleagues, NYS Assembly Member N. Nick Perry and NYS Senator Roxanne J. Persaud, we secured three grants for the purpose of combating gun violence in the district in which we preside. The grants totaling over \$200,000 will assist in the prevention of youth being caught up in the recent gun violence plaguing our great State and City. The grants were awarded to East Flatbush Village, Inc., a community-based organization combating gun violence with programs geared toward the youth in the area, providing these children with recreational activities and educational tools. East Flatbush's programs enable youth ages 3 through 18 years old to express themselves in creative and positive ways while building their self-esteem. These activities provide the youths not only with resources and outlets, but also with mentors such as teachers, coaches and volunteers, who are willing and able to guide them, all the while diverting and preventing unneeded violence. It is immensely important to take the Gun Violence issue in our communities seriously. This initiative will directly combat the gun violence crisis throughout our communities.

Food Insecurity and Distribution

Over the last year it became evident that during this COVID-19 pandemic, people began experiencing severe food insecurity because of the lack of funds to purchase food and lack of access to food. To help combat this level of food insecurity in our community I have held upwards of 30 food distributions feeding over 1,000 families in and out of the 59th Assembly District. This work has been extremely fulfilling and has been incredibly helpful to the families that have benefited during these times of hardship. I would like to thank our partners, Millennium Development, Senator Roxanne J. Persaud, Congressman Hakeem Jeffries, Councilman Alan Maisel, District Manager Sue Ann Partnow and many more for helping procure and store the beautiful fresh produce for the families in our community. I look forward to continuity
