IN REMEMBRANCE

On July 28, an unspeakable tragedy struck our neighborhood. We remember the four New Yorkers whose lives were taken at 345 Park Avenue.



Detective First Grade Didarul Islam—An NYPD officer who died in uniform protecting our community, he is remembered as a devoted husband, father, and public servant grounded in his faith. He is survived by his wife and three children, including a newborn son born days after his father's passing.



Wesley LePatner—A senior executive at Blackstone, Wesley served on the boards of UJA-Federation of New York, The Heschel School, and helped found Altenu Synagogue. She is remembered as a wife, mother, and a generous mentor who shaped many lives.



Aland "Al" Etienne—A proud father and 32BJ member, Al immigrated from Haiti. Al was known for his warmth, constant smile, and habit of putting others first—especially his two children, the center of his world.



Julia Hyman—An associate with Rudin Management, Julia pursued her passion for real estate after graduating from Cornell. At Riverdale School, she was a dedicated athlete and captained the varsity soccer, swim, and lacrosse teams. She is remembered by her family and friends for lifting up everyone around her.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

This month, Alex introduced the Digital Choice Act, legislation that would give New Yorkers the right to own and delete their personal data. This pro-consumer and pro-innovation bill recently passed in Utah, encouraging social media companies to compete over who best serves users instead of advertisers.
