

Assembly Member Seawright passed the New York State Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (Ch. 106 of 2019), which:

- ✓ Sets goals to combat climate change, including:
 - reducing greenhouse gas emissions 85% by 2050
 - producing 70% of the state's electricity from renewable energy systems by 2030
 - producing 100% of the state's electricity without emissions by 2040
- ✓ Establishes the New York State Climate Action Council to keep the state on track with its goals
- ✓ Authorizes renewable energy projects in public low-income housing statewide
- ✓ Promotes environmental justice and sets aside 35% of the overall benefits of spending on clean energy and energy efficiency for projects in disadvantaged neighborhoods
