As we are seeing a slight rise in COVID-19 cases, please take the opportunity to pick up no-cost testing kits, masks and hand sanitizer every Thursday from 12pm-2pm.

Beware of a new scam involving COVID-19 test kits by mail-- being billed for kits that were never requested! Information on this scam is enclosed, but the main tip is to not pay for anything you did not request.

Every year, New York City's 59 local Community Boards prepare a "Community District Needs" (CD Needs) statement identifying the funding priorities for their districts. These statements are key to informing the City of neighborhood and infrastructure planning and the equitable and efficient delivery of services to communities citywide. Community Board 8 (CB8) is drafting its district needs statement and is asking for all CB8 residents feedback.

We have received many inquiries concerning how reduced-fare customers can use the new OMNY fare collection system. You may have seen the new OMNY readers on buses and train stations. It is the new fare payment system that lets you pay your subway or local bus fare with a smartphone, wearable device, or contactless credit or debit card and reduced-fare customers may need support transitioning to the new system. 

What You Need To Know About...

Tap and Go With Reduced-Fare OMNY



OMNY is a fare payment system that lets you pay your subway or local bus fare with a smartphone, wearable device, or contactless credit or debit card.

How to link your Reduced-Fare benefit to OMNY: Visit the OMNY website and follow the prompts in the Digital Assistant, found in the bottom right corner of the homepage.

Follow the step-by-step process and have your Reduced-Fare MetroCard and your credit or debit card handy. Linking to OMNY will not immediately deactivate your Reduced-Fare MetroCard. You can keep your card to:

- Spend down any remaining value before expiration
- Receive reduced fares on Long Island Road Rail and Metro-North Railroad

Reduced-Fare OMNY cards

If you want to wait for a Reduced-Fare OMNY card, they will be issued soon. They will have similar functionality to today's MetroCards, along with the ability to reload value online, at retail locations, or in subway stations using OMNY vending machines (coming soon).

Switch from EasyPay to Reduced-Fare OMNY: With OMNY, you never need to add value to your card— the half-priced cost of your trip will automatically be charged each time you ride, when you use your designated Reduced-Fare OMNY payment method. Reduced-Fare OMNY cards will be issued in 2023 and if you wait for a card, you will be able to set up automatic reloads on that card with an optional online OMNY account, then close your EasyPay account.

Benefits of OMNY for Reduced-Fare customers:

- Reduced-Fare OMNY offers the same half-price fare that customers receive today, with free transfers.
- You can pay with your smartphone, wearable device, or contactless credit or debit card there's no need to carry or find an MTA-issued card.
- Track your trip history and manage your payments with a free, optional OMNY account
- Earn free rides with fare capping: Starting on Monday, take 12 OMNY trips with the same device or credit or debit card and you automatically ride free through Sunday.



There will be no Manhattan Bound F-Train Service from 9:45PM Friday 8/11 to 5:00 AM Monday 8/14

RIOC will be providing a free weekend (8/12-8/13) Manhattan Tram Shuttle starting Saturday 8/12 at 3 PM. The shuttle will depart hourly from the Tramway, making all northbound local stops to Capobianco Field (Opposite PS/IS 217). Return Red Bus service from Manhattan to Roosevelt Island will start at 3:30 PM. This bus will depart on the half hour from the Southwest side of 2nd Avenue, between 58th & 59th Street, and will make all southbound local bus stops (starting with 591 Main Street) to the Tram. The last trip will depart from the Roosevelt Island Tramway at 7:00 PM. The last trip will depart Manhattan at 7:30 PM.
