Comment on Indian Point Decommissioning

If you were not able to make a statement during the recent public statement hearing and will not be able to speak during tonight's Decommissioning Oversight Board meeting, there are several other ways to comment on the decommissioning of Indian Point. Comments should refer to "Matter 21-01188 - Indian Point Task Force and Oversight Board." Comments are requested by May 4, 2023, but will be accepted as long as the matter is open.

Comment online: Go to www.dps.ny.gov, click on "File Search" (located under the heading "Commission Files"), enter "21-01188" in the "Search by Case Number" field, and then click on "Post Comments" located at the top of the page.

Comment by mail: Comments may be mailed to the Honorable Michelle L. Phillips, Secretary, Public Service Commission, Three Empire State Plaza, Albany, New York 12223-1350. All written comments will become part of the record and may be accessed on the Department of Public Service website by searching the matter number, as described above, and clicking on the "Public Comments" tab.

Comment by phone: Individuals may choose to submit comments by calling the Department's toll-free Opinion Line at 1- 800-335-2120. This number is set up to receive in-state calls 24-hours a day. These calls are not transcribed verbatim, but a summary is provided to the Department Staff.

Redistricting Update

After several months of review and tens of thousands of public comments on the December 2022 maps, the Independent Redistricting Commission released a new Assembly map on April 20th. I am happy to report that the April map keeps our current district configuration, rather than changing it as the December map proposed. New Laws

New state laws go into effect every month. Here are the new laws taking effect in May 2023:

Effective Date	Chapter	Summary
5/3/2023	Ch. 578 of 2021 A.7604 S.6783	Updates mandatory continuing education requirements for architects.

5/20/2023	Ch. 623 of 2022 A.2344-A S.8102-A Ch. 75 of 2023 A.1002 S.819	Requires the Department of Health to provide food allergy awareness notices for use in food establishments and online food ordering services. The notice will be available in the 12 most common languages other than English.
5/22/2023	Ch. 643 of 2022 A.744 S.5262	Requires health clubs with a membership of 50 or more to have at least one automated external defibrillator on the premises which is accessible to the staff, members and guests.
5/22/2023	Ch. 644 of 2022 A.831-A S.4591-A Ch. 89 of 2023 A.605 S.852	Requires congressional, senatorial, assembly and election district maps be made available on applicable board of elections' websites and in a downloadable format.
5/22/2023	Ch. 653 of 2022 A.7560-B S.6287-C	Establishes Elizabeth's Law, which requires child care providers and pregnant patients to be provided with informational materials on the prevention of congenital cytomegalovirus infection.

5/31/2023	Ch. 658 of 2022 A.8453-A S.7572-A	Requires the website of each contractor and vendor who provides services pursuant to a state contract to conform any website with the most current version of the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines adopted by the World Wide Web Consortium for accessibility.
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
