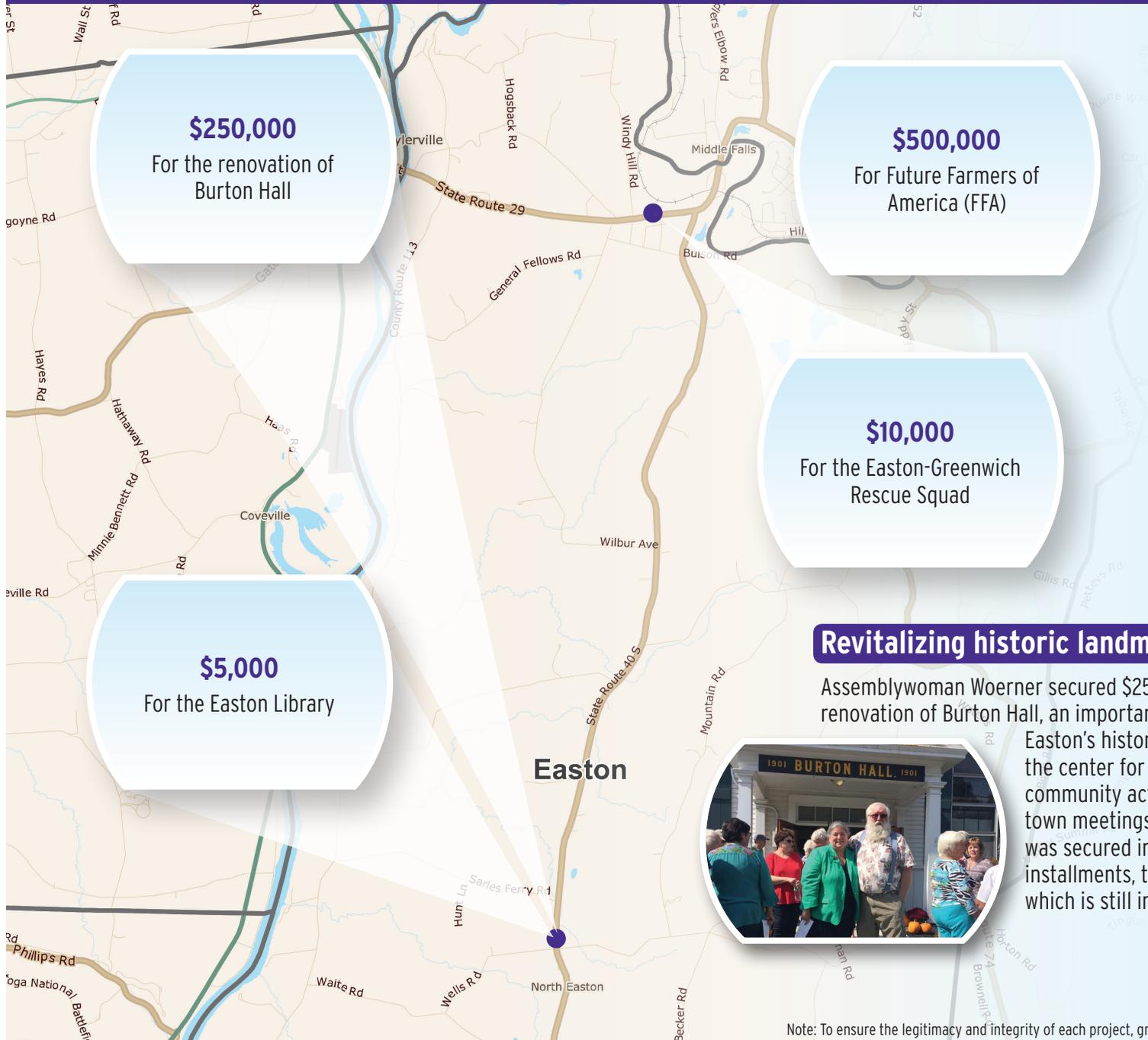

# Assemblywoman Woerner: Supporting our communities



## Supporting our first responders

To better protect our neighborhoods, Assemblywoman Woerner helped secure \$10,000 for the Easton-Greenwich Rescue Squad. This funding allowed the rescue squad to upgrade their ambulance equipment.

## Improving local libraries

Our local libraries provide residents with critical tools and resources that enrich their learning and allow them to broaden their perspectives. Assemblywoman Woerner helped secure \$5,000 in funding for the Easton Library to purchase desktop computers and a multimedia system so more residents can access the technology they need.



## Revitalizing historic landmarks

Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$250,000 for the renovation of Burton Hall, an important landmark in Easton's history and, currently, the center for numerous community activities and town meetings. The funding was secured in two \$125,000 installments, the second of which is still in progress.



## Supporting our future farmers

Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$500,000 in grant funding for the Greenwich Future Farmers of America (FFA) to purchase ag-tech equipment, which is shared between local FFA programs in Washington County, including the Greenwich FFA chapter.
