



Assemblywoman Woerner: Supporting our communities



Helping those in need

The Mercy House project, which was established by Bethesda Church, aims to provide supportive housing and other accommodations to vulnerable individuals and families in Saratoga County. To support these important efforts, Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$125,000 for Bethesda Church to continue working to expand the Mercy House project and help more individuals get on a path toward a brighter future.

Supporting New Yorkers in recovery

To help residents struggling with substance use disorders, Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$675,000 in additional money for the addiction medicine unit at Saratoga Hospital. Assemblywoman Woerner also secured \$12,500 for the Prevention Council of Saratoga Springs to train new recovery coaches. The Council's outreach includes both on- and off-site activities, meeting, and recovery coaching directly targeting individuals and their families who are in the midst of recovery.

Supporting local veterans

Assemblywoman Woerner is working hard to ensure local veterans and their families have access to the resources and support they've earned. To that end, she secured \$5,500 for Gurtler Brothers VFW Post 420 for necessary building renovations.

Boosting public safety

To better protect the health and safety of local residents, Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$250,000 for Saratoga County EMS to purchase a new Mobile Communications Command Center.

Improving roadways

From driving to work to sending our children on the bus to school, Assemblywoman Woerner knows how important it is for residents to get where they need to go safely and smoothly. That's why she secured \$250,000 for a new road grader to help improve the streets in Saratoga County.
