- Creates the rural suicide prevention council (A01680)
- Provides an Inflation Relief & Consumer Assistance Plan that would eliminate 4% sales tax charges on essential items such as prepared food, gas, and housekeeping items (A01690)
- Creates distinctive license plates for the United States Army 10th Mountain Division (A01538)
- Provides insurance premium reductions for completion of a fraud prevention course (A01537)
- Eliminates the photo image fee for veterans who have their driver's license changed to add a veteran notation (A01419)
- Establishes and authorizes telepharmacy in the state (A01359)
- Land used for processing or retail merchandising of agricultural products are exempted from real property taxes (A04964)

CARTHAGE MEMORIAL DAY EVENT






OPENING DAY CEREMONY
