## Legislative Process

New York state has three branches of government: legislative, executive, and judicial. The legislative branch consists of the Assembly and Senate members who are responsible for creating laws. Ideas for bills can come from various sources, including government agencies, statewide officials, and you.

#### **IDEA**

Policy ideas are submitted to the Bill Drafting Commission where they are translated into formal language.

#### **DRAFTING**

The bill is assigned a unique number and referred to appropriate committees for review.

#### **COMMITTEE PROCESS**

Members of standing committees examine the bill to decide if it's financially feasible and compliant with current laws. Public hearings are often held to gather more information on the bill before it's sent to the floor for votes.

#### **VOTING**

Both the Senate and Assembly need a simple majority vote to pass the bill. Debates are held and changes may be made to the legislation. Once identical bills pass in both houses, the bill is delivered to the governor.

#### **GOVERNOR SIGNATURE**


The bill, once signed by the governor, becomes law. If the governor vetoes a bill, it can still become a law when a 2/3 majority in both houses vote in favor of the bill. This is known as an "override."


