Least Affordable Care

As of 2023, New York State had the least affordable center-based care for school-aged children in the nation¹

Child Care Deserts

64% of New Yorkers live in child-care deserts, higher than the national average²

Out-of-Control Costs

In 2023, the annual cost of child care for two children in a center in New York was \$35,999, nearly \$7,000 more than the cost of housing³

- Institute a regional cost factor for child-care subsidies across the state and increase the percentage of household income eligibility (A.2373)
- Create rules and regulations that would establish a model for child-care providers that would include nights and weekends (A.4534)
- Increase the Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit by 15% (A.2314)
- Increase the Empire State Child Credit amount to 45% of the Federal Child Tax Credit amount (A.2492)



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
