Transportation Hearing Kicks Off 2024 Budget Season

On Wednesday, January 24th, Assemblyman Magnarelli along with his Assembly and Senate colleagues, held their 2024 Transportation Budget Hearing. Among those testifying before the committee at this hearing was Commissioner of Transportation, Marie Therese Dominguez.

As Chair of the Assembly's Transportation Committee, Assemblyman Magnarelli uses the testimony provided to him from relevant speakers, like Commissioner Dominguez, to understand the current state of New York's transportation infrastructure, transportation projects and the future funding needed by the State to properly execute these projects.

The Assemblyman also uses these hearings to advocate for funding for various road, bridge and infrastructure

The purpose of the meeting was to advocate for increased funding in the 2024-25 State Budget for our public transit systems.

Honoring Black History Month


