Assemblyman Gallahan voted NO on these measures:

- A \$2.1 billion stimulus fund to give undocumented immigrants unemployment benefits (A.3003-C)
- A 9.7% spending increase over last year's budget, a \$212 billion spending plan that's the most expensive in our state's history at the time of enactment
- \$7.3 million in taxpayer dollars to fund political campaigns (A.3000-D)
- ✗ A cut to in-patient mental health beds (A.3000-D)

Assemblyman Gallahan instead supported these important proposals, among many others:

- A bill that would provide a tax credit to businesses in New York state that sell New York state products (A.4631)
- Legislation that would establish term limits on leadership positions (A.4927)
- Fully repealing bail reform laws, which have caused many criminals to be released back into their community after their arrest, after which, many of whom have gone on to reoffend (A.4349)
- A bill that would create a wage tax credit for employers who employ New York National Guard men and women, reservists, volunteer firefighters, and EMS personnel (A.3681)
