Dear neighbor,

I hope this finds you and your family well. My first year as your Assemblymember has been one filled with invaluable lessons, vital coalition building and productive legislative headway that will build a better state for all New Yorkers.

As a state, we've made substantial gains and progress this past year as we continue our economic recovery from Covid-19. The New York State Assembly Majority took great strides to ensure that residents receive the support and resources they need to weather the storm.

Through the legislative funding process, I am proud to have secured \$40,000 for youth programs in the Village of Hamburg, \$30,000 for pickleball courts in the Village of Blasdell, and \$42,000 in parks and recreation improvements in the Town of Hamburg.

This year's state budget provides the Hamburg Central School District and Frontier Central School District with a combined \$68.7 million of funding from New York State for FY 2021-2022. The \$68.7 million of combined funding for schools in Hamburg in 2021-2022 represents a 10.6 percent increase from last year's state funding for the districts. Hamburg will receive \$28.8 million (a \$2.9 million increase) and Frontier will receive \$39.9 million (a \$3.7 million increase).

To help middle-class families, included in this year's budget package is a property tax credit in the form of a "circuit breaker" to provide tax credits on state income taxes. It will provide a personal income tax credit for certain property taxpayers who pay a disproportionate share of their income to property taxes.

Two bills that I helped to pass will protect homeowners and renters from the dangers of lead-based paint. The Department of Financial Services allows insurance companies to write general liability policies that specifically exclude lead poisoning claims from their coverage. Bill A.7488 requires that liability coverage includes injuries

or damage caused by exposure to lead paint.

Bill A6608A, or the "Lead-based Paint Disclosure Act," requires property owners to conduct lead paint tests and provide the reports of such tests before selling or leasing the property. This bill will also give state health officials the knowledge of which properties do and do not have lead paint hazards.

In order to safeguard health care workers and improve nursing homes, legislation passed this session focuses on quality improvement, oversight and transparency, and enforcement. Additional bills passed (A.108-B, A.7119) will set and enforce safe staffing ratios in nursing homes and hospitals across the state.
