## ORAL TESTIMONY BY INVITATION ONLY

In March, a state of emergency was declared in New York State due to the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, requiring libraries to close and shift to virtual services. As the state has begun to reopen, libraries and library systems have resumed providing in-person services again, but with enhanced protocols to ensure the health and safety of library staff and patrons. The Committee seeks testimony on the reopening of libraries and the challenges libraries and library systems have faced due to COVID-19. In addition, the Committee seeks testimony on the critical role libraries have played during this unprecedented time in ensuring digital equity and access to information for all New Yorkers.

Persons invited to present pertinent testimony to the Committee at the above hearing should complete and return the enclosed reply form as soon as possible. It is important that the reply form be fully completed and returned so that persons may be notified of means by which to testify and/or in the event of emergency postponement or cancellation.

Oral testimony will be limited to 5 minutes' duration. In preparing the order of witnesses, the Committee will attempt to accommodate individual requests to speak at particular times in view of special circumstances. These requests should be made on the attached reply form or communicated to Committee staff as early as possible.

Attendees and participants at any legislative public hearing should be aware that these proceedings are video recorded. Their likenesses may be included in any video coverage shown on television or the internet.

In order to further publicize these hearings, please inform interested parties and organizations of the Committee's interest in hearing testimony from all sources.

In order to meet the needs of those who may have a disability, the Assembly, in accordance with its policy of non-discrimination on the basis of disability, as well as the 1990 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), has made its facilities and services available to all individuals with disabilities.
