Dear President-Elect Biden,

As members of the New York Congressional Delegation, New York State Legislature, and New York City Council, we write to draw your attention to the very real impacts of food insecurity on our state, particularly in the wake of necessary COVID-19 lockdown measures, and to request your support for increased funding and administrative action to address these critical matters upon your assumption of the Presidency.

The number of New Yorkers who are considered "food insecure" is projected to increase from 2.2 million to 3.1 million of our constituents due to COVID-19. Food insecurity in New York City alone is on pace to *nearly double*, increasing from 1.2 million to 2 million individuals. All told, 1 in 4 kids in our state could face hunger this year.

In addition to these most vulnerable of our constituents, millions of New Yorkers who are not classified as food insecure continue to come closer to the threshold, and face difficult decisions as budgets are strained from the economic fallout of the pandemic.

In light of this, we strongly urge your transition team and future Administration to implement the following requests for long-term investments to reduce hunger:

1. In order to improve the adequacy of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, use the low-cost food plan as the basis for determining benefit levels instead of the thrifty food plan—a change that will increase the maximum benefit by at least 15 percent—and increase the minimum benefit from \$16 to 30.

- 2. Strengthen SNAP's support for work by increasing the federal income eligibility level to 200% of the federal poverty level and removing or relaxing the eligibility asset limits.
- 3. Rescind the Trump Administration's harmful final rules related to Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) and Public Charge. Also, halt the Administration's proposed SNAP rules related to the Standard Utility Allowance (SUA) and Broad-Based Categorical Eligibility (BBCE).
- 4. Provide immigrants nutrition program benefits and other basic needs support.
- 5. For the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic, ensure that all SNAP recipients receive Emergency Allotments of SNAP, including households that already receive the maximum benefit; and provide retroactive benefits back to March 2020 for all who are eligible. Also, ensure that enhanced unemployment insurance is not countable income for SNAP or any other federal nutrition assistance program.
- 6. Increase access to school meals by eliminating the reduced-price category and expanding the eligibility threshold for free school meals to 250% of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- 7. Require direct certification for free school meals of children on Medicaid up to 250% FPL, and all disabled children regardless of income, or, alternatively, reinstate and expand the direct certification pilots from the Obama administration.
- 8. Extend categorical eligibility for free school meals to children placed in kinship care, children in households that participate in the Low-Income Heating Assistance Program (LIHEAP), and children in military households that receive the Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance
- 9. Close the summer meal gap by permanently authorizing nationwide expansion of the Summer EBT for Children Program (SEBTC) and eliminating the congregate site requirement for summer meals.
- 10. Reduce the eligibility threshold for open summer meal sites to include communities where at least 40%--rather than 50%--of students are eligible for free and reduced-price school meals.
- 11. Streamline the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) At-Risk Afterschool Meals component for non-profit sponsors, following the SFSP regulations.
- 12. Ensure access to the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) by making permanent the flexibilities allowing remote enrollment,

- services and benefits issuance, and the facilitation of online ordering. Extend certification periods to 2 years and enrollment for children until their sixth birthday.
- 13. Support \$500 million for The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) food purchases to address increased need for food assistance due to COVID-19. Emergency food providers need additional food to meet the unprecedented demand in communities nationwide.
- 14. Make the USDA SNAP online purchasing pilot program permanent and facilitate more vendor participation.
- 15. Amend SNAP policy to permit benefits to cover hot food items provided by traditional SNAP retailers

The implementation of these requests would provide life-sustaining support to millions of New Yorkers and Americans who are struggling as a result of this pandemic. We greatly appreciate your consideration, and we thank you for working with us to get our country back on its feet.
